LOCAL KNOWLEDGE: How to Enter the Basin at Chesapeake City without running aground

Boaters should enter Chesapeake City's basin with caution. There is a sizeable shoal in the center of what appears to be a trouble-free approach to the town's waterfront. The constant passage of deep-draft commercial shipping creates the shoal that hangs up many a boater who attempt to enter without local knowledge. **The best water depths are close to the bulkhead of the Army Corps of Engineers' property — the east side of the entrance to the basin.** A RED marker was placed in the entrance to mark a safe passage into the basin in the late summer of 2014. Winter's ice floes took the marker out but the town plans to replace it as soon as possible.

TOWN DOCKS

Located on the west side of the basin. Dockmaster: 443-350-2442. **2 Transient Slips; Room for 3 to 4 boats** to tie up on the long dock. Free. Donation asked for water and electric. First come-first serve. 2-day limit. Depth: 4-ft. MLW

SCHAEFERS RESTAURANT & CANAL BAR • VHF Channel 16/68

Deep water transient slips along canal bulkhead. Tie up overnight or for restaurant visit. **Gas, Diesel** pumped from 9 to 9 daily; Fri./Sat. 9 to 10. Fuel prices available on activecaptain.com. 30-amp & 50-amp electric. Marine Supply store. Dockmaster: 410-885-7200.

ANCHORAGE: Depths in the basin behind the Army Corps of Engineers property run between 10-ft and 12-ft at MLW. A **FREE WATER TAXI** is available from the Chesapeake Inn. VHF 69.
