# Town Council Meeting May 13, 2019

Town Meeting April 8, 2019

**MOTION:** Councilman Adams made a motion, seconded by Councilman Hill to accept the Town Meeting Minutes from April 8, 2019 with corrections. All in favor, motion carried.

**MOTION:** Councilman Vari made a motion, seconded by Councilwoman Blevins to approve the minutes from the Town Council Special Session April 12, 2019. All in favor, motion carried.

Town Council April 22, 2019 Public Hearing, Special Session, Workshop **MOTION:** Councilman Adams made a motion, seconded by Councilwoman Blevins to accept the minutes from the April 22, 2019 meeting. All in favor, motion carried.

### **PROCLAMATIONS**

Peace Officer Memorial Day and Police Week Mayor Taylor read the Proclamation into the minutes.

National Safe Boating Week Councilman Vari read the proclamation aloud and presented it to members of the Coast Guard.

#### Reports

Councilwoman Blevins: Reviewed the State Police Report from last week; have been in contacted by Chief Police on in Port Deposit regarding safety matters.

Councilman Adams: Josh from Miller Environmental gave the flow summaries for both the north and south plant. No violations last month. Do not see any violations for this month. RFPs were due today. Three applications were opened at Town Hall. They will be reviewed and discussed at the workshop; Town manager gave his update on the water and sewer issues. Reviewing concept review for Schaefer's parking lot, north of Biddle Street.

Councilman Vari – Public Works- a lot of spring landscaping, nine different flower beds, congratulations to Maintenance Staff for their work. Town Manager gave an update on 301 toll meeting; Equipment will be coming in around Memorial Day Weekend for the patching and

resurfacing on Biddle Street; patching to take place as soon as possible. If anyone wants any of the plantings in the islands you can go get them now. The Town currently has the highest percentage so far for recycling. Special Events – Opening Ceremonies at Brantwood Park, while not completely finished, the county has done nice work up there. Social Local Thursday will be celebrating the first anniversary of Café on Bay and Inn on the Canal. June 3 is Election Day. Racing program is under way for the June 29 race; Sponsors are almost all in and the participants starting to register. Councilman Hill inquired about the Hazardous Waste Day: it was busy until they closed at 4 and believes they will have one next year, too. The RFP for Trash and Recycling is posted.

Councilman Hill – Bridge Loan for the water tower has been converted to a bond and payments start in July. Finance Committee meeting soon about the water & sewer rates. No activity for the Historic Commission. Capital Improvements no updates. A lot of activity at the docks.

Treasurer Valerie Walls: Council given printouts of bank balances from Howard Bank and check registers of bills paid since the beginning of May.

Town Manager Rob Bernstine: Everything has been covered.

Mayor Taylor: Will be attending the meeting in Charlestown about the Opiod lawsuit and bring information back to our workshop. Mentioned to Val & Tonya to try and get addresses from the boaters to send notes/cards about visiting our town.

#### Constant Yield Tax Rate
